My thanks to you, Anne, for the strong and caring leadership that you provide to the school. I know you are committed to creating a positive and enabling environment for staff and pupils alike. Ofsted recognised the high expectations you hold and your knowledge of your school; you and your team know what to do to improve. You continue to demonstrate your dedication, determination and hard work. Because of this the school has secured its good judgement. I was so pleased to read how highly regarded you and other leaders are by your team. Your leadership has created a supportive culture and your staff recognise and appreciate this. Consequently, they enjoy their work and being part of the school team. Staff, parents and pupils are all rightly proud of their school. This ensures they become confident and independent learners which we know will support them as they move through life.

You must be pleased to see Ofsted acknowledging the good behaviour of pupils and the consistent approach used by your staff to ensure this; the inspector commented on the warm and supportive relationships that exist in the school. Crucially, you have ensured that pupils feel safe at Cockton Hill Infants. You also teach them how to support their local community and how they can positively impact upon it. This all helps prepare young children to grow up into considerate and engaged citizens.

The inspector also commented on the effective way in which you support pupils with SEND, ensuring they are able to access the curriculum through your work with them and the additional support they receive.

Ofsted recognised that you create a strong culture of safeguarding and that staff know what to do to keep children safe. This is because you ensure they are well-trained and have up-to-date guidance. It is also because you take time to develop knowledge of your families and work with other agencies to keep children safe.

Congratulations on developing and maintaining a strong team that enables pupils to thrive and learn. Achieving this, coupled with the current educational climate and constraints on schools, should be recognised and applauded. It is a great credit to everyone connected with your school that the children attending Cockton Hill Infants continue to benefit from such a good quality education.
